Linda Burkett, MD, MSc, an Assistant Professor in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology and former BIRCWH Scholar, was awarded an NIH K23 award focused on improving long-term outcomes in sacral neuromodulation in those with urinary urgency and voiding dysfunction.

Kelsey Hagan, PhD, LP, an Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychiatry and former BIRCWH Scholar, was awarded an NIH K23 grant for her project focused on using a neurocomputational approach to explore the development of bulimia nervosa in adolescents.

- "Role of Estrogen Formulation and Route of Delivery on Skeletal Outcomes in Functional Hypothalamic Amenorrhea"
 - Looking for female participants who have stopped have menstrual periods
 - Inclusion criteria: ages 14-30, fewer than 3 menstrual periods in the past 6 months

- Exclusion criteria: current hormonal contraception/medications, major surgeries planned over the next 18 months, pregnancy or planning to become pregnant in the next 2 years
- 9 study visits over 12 months at the University of Virginia Medical Center
- Participants will be compensated up to \$925 total and up to \$25 for travel
