- Awarded Grants and Publications
 - Jessie Oldham, PhD, was awarded an R01 through NINDS examining psychophysiological deficits in adolescents following concussion and the relationship with subsequent musculoskeletal injury. This is the first R01 for PM&R/CERSE.
 - Arnethea Sutton, PhD, an assistant professor in the Department of Kinesiology and Health Sciences published a recent article in <u>Cancer Medicine</u> that examined breast cancer survivors' perceptions of heart health during active treatment and associations with race.
 - Alex Krist, MD, MPH, professor in VCU Family Medicine, has had multiple works highlighted in the <u>media</u> in recent weeks.
